CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in International Equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses' welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health, before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the Event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper Veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED

Entries need to be done directly on the KPC Online System and payment done via Payfast.

Bought and Sold Entries will be allowed as long as the correct documentation is submitted within the correct time frames and the original rider has signed the form.

There will be no buying and selling of entries after 25th of June 2023. Forms received thereafter will not be accepted.

REFUNDS: No Refunds will be given after closing date of entries. Entries withdrawn before close of date will be refunded less Payfast fees. However due to inclement weather conditions or other unforeseen circumstances, should it necessitate cancelling the show, 80% of the entry fee will be refunded.

Bank Details: All entries to be paid for online via Payfast. Unpaid entries will not save on the system

ENTRY FEE: R500 per Class (incl. R64.98 KPC Arena Levy, R4.50 EDS Levy, R37.50 SASA Levy, R50 Officials fee, R23.65 Paramedics/Security)

Plus, R50 refundable Number Deposit per horse

TEMP. MEMBERSHIP: There will be a temporary membership arena fee of R150 for competitors not a member of Kyalami Park Club. This is to be paid once per rider. If Entering Jumping please pay the temp membership with your jumping entries and then when entering the showing, you may declare that you are a member as you would have paid the temp membership already

PRIZEMONEY: A minimum of 60% net of entry fees less levies and VAT for open classes plus sponsorship and 40% less levies and VAT Novice & Intermediate classes plus sponsorship per class. This excludes sponsorship money that will be independently allocated by the OC.

SUBSTITUTIONS: A substitution is a change of horse ONLY. This should be done no later than 30 minutes before the start of the class. The substituted horse needs to be capable of jumping the relevant height and technicality of the track for the class relevant to the substitution. A portfolio of evidence must be available if required.

PHOTOS: Please note competitors winning photos will be published on Social media with results. Should you not want your child's photos published please let us know.

DRESS: Jackets Only

STABLING: Stabling will be available at **R230 per day/night OR R1100 for the duration of the show.** Stabling is limited and will be booked on a first come first serve basis. Initial bedding will be provided. Out of country horses need not pay for stabling for provincial classes. Stable Form Link: <https://forms.gle/igJYy9cFuBkFW9i78>

NO PADDOCKS WILL BE ALLOWED ON THE VENUE

ALL COMPETITORS needing stabling MUST COMPLETE the Stable booking form and submit the booking prior to arriving at the show.

Initial Bedding will be provided, additional bedding will be available to purchase at R30 per bag.

Competitors entering an Equitation class do so on the understanding that their horse must be available should it be required by the judges or organising committee for a draw or a mystery horse for other competitors to ride.

The allocation of stabling accommodation is carried out by the Show Director and under no circumstances may any competitor change his/her stabling accommodation or alter the stabling list without prior consultation with, and approval of, the Show director.

Failure to comply could involve disqualification of the horse concerned.

Stables will be allocated to out of Province rider first, on a first come first paid basis.

Competitors wishing to be stabled with others should indicate this on their stable booking form, however please bear in mind that if the person you are wanting to be stabled with has booked early and you have booked late or vice versa this allocation may not be possible as stables are allocated strictly on a first booked and paid for basis.

The grooms are encouraged to hand walk horses.

GALA EVENING: Details will be sent out.

GROOMS MEALS: Can be purchased at the Kiosk

ACCESS: **Free Access**
All horseboxes and floats must be parked in the allocated area provided.

PASSPORTS: All horses must be in possession of their FEI Passports or Group IX Passports at all shows. Inspections, sampling and random passport checks, may take place at any event. All horses competing in FEI Classes must have FEI passports or FEI Recognition cards and must be registered with the FEI for 2019 Horse Registrations. N/A

AHS and EQUINE FLU REGULATIONS

1 African Horse Sickness (AHS)

African Horse Sickness is a controlled disease in South Africa; therefore, any suspicion of a clinical case of AHS anywhere in the country must be reported to the local State Veterinarian immediately.

Symptoms of AHS include high temperature, rapid breathing, coughing followed by a frothy fluid from the nostrils and death within a few hours. In less acute cases, swelling of the neck and head particularly above the eyes and redness of the mucous membranes.

1 African Horse Sickness Zones

The Republic of South Africa has been divided into four zones, namely:

- 1 AHS Free Zone
- 2 AHS Surveillance Zone
- 3 AHS Protection Zone
- 4 AHS Infected Zone.

All Equines in South Africa except in the AHS Free and Surveillance Zones are required to be vaccinated against AHS annually, with an effective remedy registered in section 1, of Act 101 of 1965.

Equines residing in the AHS Free and AHS Surveillance Zones require permission from the State Directorate for vaccination against AHS.

All equines residing in the AHS Protection and Infected Zones must be vaccinated annually against AHS.

In the AHS Free, Surveillance and Protection Zone vaccination is only allowed between 1st June and 31st October of each year.

Whilst it is not a requirement that horses in the AHS Infected Zone be vaccinated between 1st June and 31st October it has been strongly recommended.

Therefore, the SAEF AHS Vaccination Requirements are as follows:

- 1 All Equines competing in SAEF events are required to have an annual AHS vaccine with a vaccine registered under Act 101 of 1965. The vaccine consists of AHS 1 and AHS 2. The vaccine has to be administered by a registered Veterinarian, registered with the South African Veterinary Council with a minimum period of 21 days between the two vaccines.
- 2 The Vaccine and batch number must be written in the appropriate vaccination page and signed and stamped by the Veterinarian administering the vaccine.
- 3 Horses residing in the AHS Free, Surveillance and Protection Zones may only be vaccinated between 1st June and 31st of October each year.
- 4 Horses that reside in the AHS Free and Surveillance Zones and participate in events in these Zones only are exempt from the necessity of annual AHS vaccination. However, if they wish to compete in the AHS Protection or AHS Infected Zones, they must be vaccinated.
- 5 AHS vaccinations that are given with an interval of less than the minimum 21 days are null and void for both vaccinations and horses that have received such vaccinations will be deemed not to have been vaccinated.

No horse may compete for 7 days following any vaccination.

Competitors entering an Equitation class do so on the understanding that their horse must be available should it be required by the judges or organising committee for a draw or a mystery horse for other competitors to ride.

Equine Influenza (EI)

1. All Horses participating in SAEF Events must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza
2. An initial Primary Course of two vaccinations must be given; the second vaccination must be administered within 21-92 days of the first vaccination.

In completing the primary course of the vaccinations, the vaccine must be the same manufacturer for example you initially vaccinate with Proteq the second must be the same.

3. The First Booster must be given within 7 calendar months following the date of administration of the second vaccination of the primary Course.

All horses that were certified as correctly receiving the Primary Course prior to 1 January 2005 (under previous regulations), are not required to fulfill the requirement for the First Booster, providing there has been no lapse in their vaccination regime.

4. Booster Vaccinations

- a) The minimum booster frequency is every 12 months.
- b) However, for Horses competing, the last Booster must have been given within 6 months +21 days (and not within 7 days) before arrival at the Event.

Equine Influenza Vaccination Requirements

Horses can compete for up to 6 months +21 days after the 2nd vaccination of the Primary Course, however they cannot compete if they have been vaccinated within 7 days of arriving at an event venue. (e.g. may enter venue after 8 October 2014).
Subsequent Boosters	III. MINIMUM: within one year of previous booster vaccination. COMPETING: must usually be in the 6 months +21 days of previous booster vaccination.	Horses must have been vaccinated to comply with the requirements for the Primary Course, First Booster and all subsequent boosters. Horses must have been vaccinated within 6 months +21 days of arriving at the Event however they cannot compete if they have been vaccinated within 7 days of arriving at an event venue.

MEDICATION CONTROL:

MCP testing as per SAEF Regulations will be done by the appointed Testing Vet.
Laboratory: National Horse Racing Authority, Turffontein Racecourse, Turf Club Street.

PROTESTS & APPEALS:

As per General Regulations. All protests and Objections must be done in writing within the required timelines and in receipt of a R750 deposit.

Team Entries:

Notice by Provinces of their intention to participate in Team Championships must be sent to the Show Secretary, in writing with a copy to SAEF & SAEQA (admin@saeqa.co.za), by no later 16th June 2023. Team nominations, on the prescribed forms, must be completed and received by the Show Secretary (copy to SAEF & SAEQA) by 21st June 2023 at 16h00. Each Province may only enter one team. All team entries must be entered in the individual classes for the discipline concerned.

For all other teams, the Team Managers must submit to the Show Secretary their final team selection from those nominated not later than 15:00 or such later time as the discipline Representative shall determine on the day preceding the start of the Team Championship concerned.

The draw for Team Championships will be done the day before each Championship at a time to be declared by the OC.

The rules governing the substitution of team horses and/or riders are laid down in in the relevant discipline rules and General Regulations. Should two or more Provincial Bodies be unable to compete in the National Team Championship in any discipline due to lack of competitors/horses of the required standard, then those Provincial Bodies may combine to send one team.

This team shall in all respects be deemed to be a team entered by a Province. **All team Athletes and Horses should be entered in the show and the onus is on the rider and province concerned to ensure that team entries are done prior to closing date of entries or arenas filling up.**

Equitation Rules & Regulations:

1. All classes will be run under SAEQA Equitation Rules & Regulations as per SAEQA Equitation Rules 3rd Edition revised 1st November 2018.
2. Copies of the Tests to be ridden will be circulated to the respective Provincial Discipline Chairman and published on the respective Provincial & SAEQA websites at closing date of entries.
3. Entry Fees are not refundable. The Vest Deposit of R50 is refundable up to the last day of the show.
4. If entries are less than 8 in each section classes may be combined for the purpose of running, however separate prizes will be awarded.
5. Open team & individual championships will take precedence over normal Jumping classes and competitors will not be excused once the class has started.

Competitors entering an Equitation class do so on the understanding that their horse must be available should it be required by the judges or organising committee for a draw or a mystery horse for other competitors to ride.

Special Dispensation

A special Dispensation has been granted by the National Equestrian Committee and Rule 4.5.3 a. which reads as follows: These Championships are open to athletes who have obtained a minimum of 4 grading points in Open Equestrian competitions in their relevant age category in the time period after the last day of the 2021 SA Championship event until the closing date of entries for the next upcoming relevant SA Championship event.

Motivation: The championships are being held 6 months earlier this year, this will allow a wider margin of time for the competitors to have qualified either via SANESA or SAEQA competitions. They must have however qualified in their respective age category.

They will also have to comply with Appendix E - Grading Points, where it states under Point 4, that the horse/pony they wish to compete on has successfully competed in events in the equivalent height category in either Eventing/Show Jumping/SANESA (Proof of Evidence is required).
